



Bright Skies Ahead for James Blake

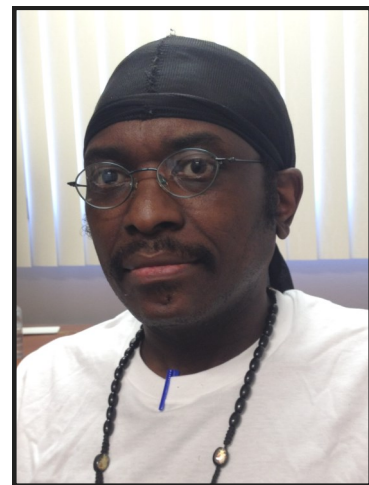


James Blake has an energy that is infectious. As soon as he enters the room, his bright smile and outgoing personality let you know that good things are ahead for this SJH resident. Originally from nearby Wynnefield, Blake (as his friends call him) grew up in a loving and supportive home. His father worked for the City of Philadelphia and his mother was a receptionist in a doctor's office. "I graduated from Overbook High

School and I loved playing sports and being with my friends," says Blake. After high school, Blake earned his barber's license and was on the road to a successful career. Unfortunately, life took some unfortunate turns and Blake was incarcerated for three years. After serving his time, Blake now looks optimistically towards the future. He admits, "I've had a rollercoaster life, but I know now that I want to make positive changes for myself and my family." Blake's mother and his two children, (thirteen-year-old twins), are the driving force in his life and a constant source of motivation to succeed. Thanks to Saint John's Hospice, Blake was able to get his life in order and look forward to a future with them. "St. John's is the greatest thing that could have ever happened to me. Before coming here, I knew nothing about the shelter system. My friend told me that St. John's was the best shelter in the city, and after seven months of living here, I believe it for myself. It's a place where you can get a jumpstart on life. If you hang in there, SJH will help you move forward and get yourself together." As for the future, Blake is focused on family: "I plan to open up another barber shop in Philadelphia. I want my kids to be happy and be with me. I want to provide a good life for them and all my family—thanks to St. John's, the sky's the limit!"

From Johannesburg to Philadelphia, for Edgeworth Nyatti Life is New Again

Edgeworth Nyatti, or "Edge" as he is known by the SJH staff and residents, has experienced both ups and downs in his life. Originally from Johannesburg, South Africa, Edge along with his mother and one of his sisters, moved to Philadelphia in 1987 in search of a better life. He attended Olney High School and then went on to earn his degree in Marketing from LaSalle University. After college, Edge remained in Philadelphia and worked as a day trader for over 15 years. During this time, he suffered the loss of several of his family members. He remembers this time as the beginning of his downward spiral into a life of depression and alcoholism: "At that time, everything started to fall apart. I was making bad decisions and stopped taking care of myself. I started drinking and my depression got worse." Edge also suffers from epilepsy, a neurological disorder which causes seizures. Because of all this, his remaining family distanced themselves from him, wanting nothing to do with him.



He had lost all hope: "I came to St. John's to die. I weighed 98 pounds and had given up. Whatever family I once had, abandoned me; I no longer cared about anything." When Edge arrived at Saint John's, he was both surprised and thankful to find a staff that was so caring and supportive, helping him to repair his life and move forward. "I thank St. John's for everything. This staff is my family." As for his future, Edge plans to return to the working world and hopes to see his own children further their education, and hopefully, one day attend his alma mater, La Salle University.

I have often been asked whether Pope Francis will be coming to St. John's Hospice in September. The only answer I could give is that no such announcement had been made. The truth is, however, that even though his schedule has now been announced, we still cannot be absolutely certain whether Pope Francis will visit SJH, or other places not listed on his published itinerary. This Pope has established a reputation for being unpredictable, for going where he feels led.

Regardless, the question is wonderful to hear. The reason ties to the explicit comments that often accompany the question: "St. John's Hospice is the kind of place that Pope Francis likes to visit." Indeed, he has emphasized again and again that we are called to look after our neighbors, particularly the poor and those on the margins of society. This certainly includes the homeless persons that SJH serves.

Will Pope Francis come to SJH? Will any of us meet him? As awe-inspiring as that would be, I suspect that he himself would say that the more important issue is whether we follow the example he is setting for us – whether we look after our neighbor. The cool thing is that St. John's Hospice is, in fact, the kind of place that does just that. We do look after our neighbors who are homeless, and we do seem to be the kind of place that Pope Francis might say, "Keep up the good work." Even if we don't get the chance to see Pope Francis face to face, we have the opportunity to meet God in the faces of the homeless men who walk through our doors every day. What is more, despite the imperfections in our love, many of our men know that we see God in them, and they find ways to communicate their appreciation for this. How cool is that?!

The staff and volunteers at SJH feel very good about that. You, our supporters, should also feel good! You also care for your neighbor whenever you write us a check, or volunteer your time, or pray on behalf of St. John's Hospice. You share in our ministry to the homeless.

Thank you for supporting this ministry. At the end of this fiscal year, we particularly wish to thank you for your generous support of our Annual Appeal, which far exceeded the goal of \$325,000. More than 1,800 donors have given gifts totaling in excess of \$500,000. This year-long fundraising effort is the vital core of our operational income, and we could not function without it. Thank you for partnering with us to provide life-giving sustenance and supportive services to our homeless brothers. You are answering Pope Francis' message to bring God's love to so many in need.

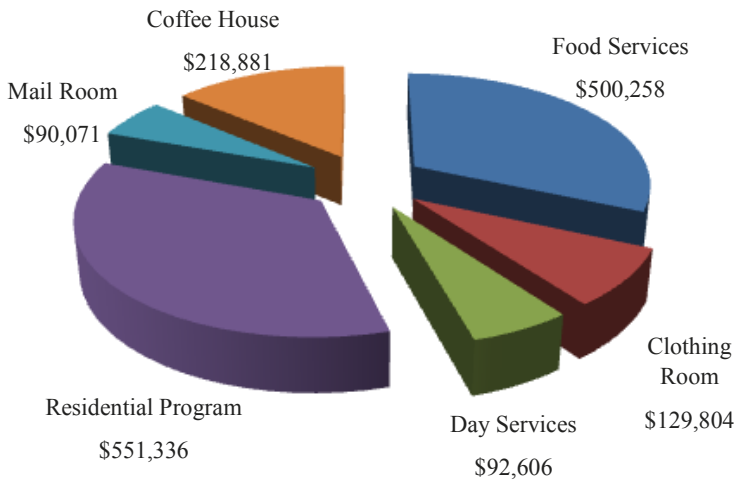

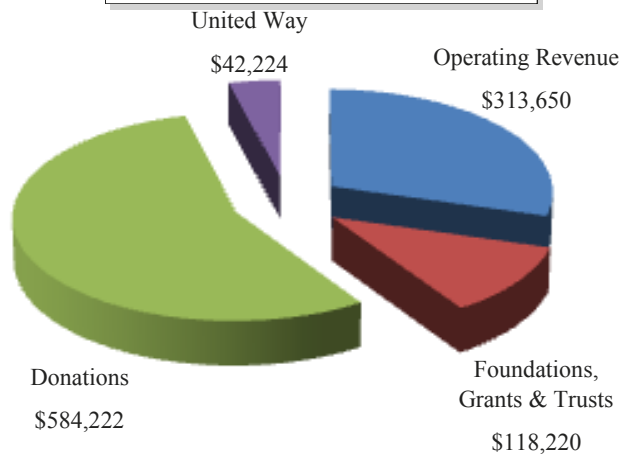


Endowment Fund

- The Endowment Fund is built from legacies and bequests as well as returns on fund investments.
- For every year since the fund was established in 1990, costs and expenses exceeded operating revenues. The endowment fund covered these shortfalls.

Saint John's Hospice FY 2014 at a glance:

- Provided approximately 2,842 **meals** each week, totaling over 145,000 meals for the year
- **Housed** 145 homeless men in the SJH residential program
- Provided 7,500 **showers** and **clean clothing** to the homeless community
- **Sheltered** 582 chronically homeless men in the emergency drop-in shelter/SJH Coffee House
- Offered **supportive services** (case management, counseling, referral, and medical assistance) to 5,640 homeless men and residents combined
- Provided a **mailing address** and mailroom services for 900 men with no home

In-kind Donations for FY 2014

- **\$400,000 in Volunteer Hours:** SJH averages 3,350 volunteer hours each month. Saint John's Hospice values each volunteer's time at \$20/hr.
- **\$300,000 in Food & Casseroles:** SJH serves 126,000 casseroles each year valued at \$15 each, totaling \$186,000 in in-kind donations, as well as additional food items received from various businesses in the community
- **\$50,000 in Clothing & Toiletries:** donations from generous donors enable SJH to provide clean clothing and toiletries every day of the week to the homeless community
